


“B” Literates-- Closed







Janice showed both her recipes (Cranberry Brie Bites & Tomato Bruschetta), Faith did her cornbread recipe and Jaime did her Petite Filet Martini recipe... **see it below!**

PRIME FILET MARTINIS

1 lb. cooked lean trimmed filet mignon, cubed
1 cup uncooked onions, sliced
1 cup mushrooms, sliced
1 Tbsp. olive oil
2 Tbsp. (low-sodium) soy sauce
1 Tbsp. minced garlic
1 tsp. salt, ½ tsp. black pepper

- Place soy sauce and seasonings into a large bowl, add filet mignon and toss to completely incorporate spices. Set aside

- Put olive oil in a large saute pan (spray w/PAM to spread oil).

- Add sliced onions and saute. NOTE : If you want caramelized onions, add a packet of Splenda to sauteing onions. After sautéing onions, set aside. Keep warm

-Repeat with mushrooms (no Splenda for these). Set aside. Keep warm.

- Add filet to hot saute pan and brown until cooked.
- Place Mock mashed potatoes in bottom of Martini Glass, top w/onions and mushrooms if desired. Add piping hot Filet Mignon.

Serve immediately. Savor!
